Love enables us to forgive sins of others in community (1 Peter 4:7-8)

1. Show Hospitality to one another (1 Peter 4:9 & Matthew 25:31-46)
 - a. Not begrudgingly or “because we have to”
 - b. Opening up our lives and sacrificing for each other as Jesus did
2. Serve one another (1 Peter 4:10-11 & 1 Cor. 12:4-27, Hebrews 10:23-25)
 - a. Mixed up grace: using our gifts to give each other grace
 - b. These gifts are “received,” given by God for others
 - c. All gifts glorify God, therefore everyone’s presence is needed for the body to be healthy
